DIRECTIONS AND PARKING

The event will be held in the Auditorium at the Washington Group International (WGI) Central Plaza, 720 Park Blvd, Boise ID. Because there is not sufficient parking to handle routine visits and the events that the occupants host, American Resurgens (the building management company) requires persons attending an event to park across the street. Disabled persons do NOT have to park across the street.

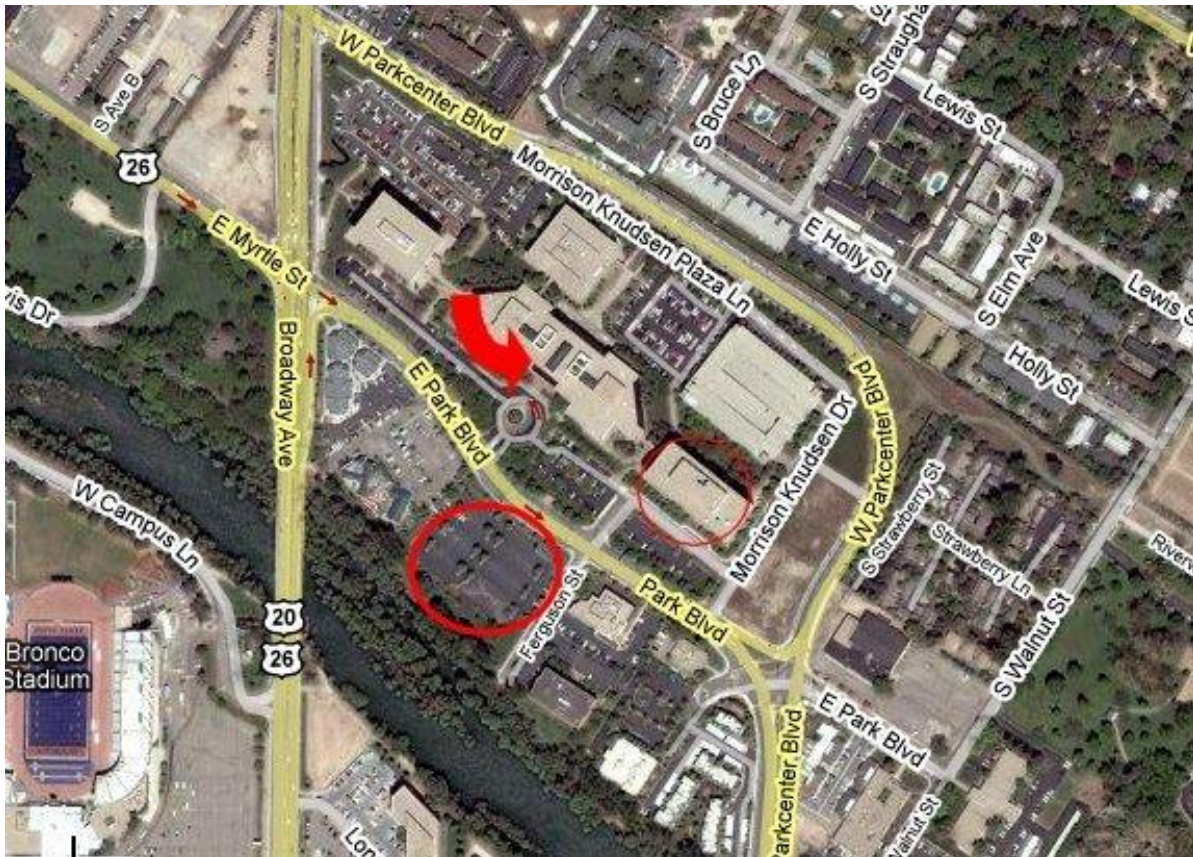
East Bound I-84: The Boise airport sits alongside Interstate 84. Take I-84 east approximately 1.5 miles to Broadway Exit-54. After exiting I-84, take a left on Broadway traveling north for approximately 3 miles (you will pass Boise State University and cross over the Boise River). Turn right (east) on Park Blvd. Stay in the right hand lane, go up about two short blocks and take a right (south) onto Ferguson St, and park in the large lot to the right. You will need to walk across Park Blvd to get to WGI Plaza. You will want to enter the building at the entrance behind the large fountain.

West Bound I-84: Take the Broadway Exit-54. After exiting I-84, take a right on Broadway traveling north for approximately 3 miles (you will pass Boise State University and cross over the Boise River). Turn right (east) on Park Blvd. Stay in the right hand lane, go up about two short blocks and take a right (south) onto Ferguson St, and park in the large lot to the right. You will need to walk across Park Blvd to get to WGI Plaza. You will want to enter the building at the entrance behind the large fountain.

North Bound I-184: I-184 becomes Myrtle St, and Myrtle St becomes Park Blvd. Continue on Myrtle St past Broadway, get in the right hand lane, go up about two short blocks and take a right (south) onto Ferguson St, and park in the large lot to the right. You will need to walk across Park Blvd to get to WGI Plaza. You will want to enter the building at the entrance behind the large fountain.
