
Caring About Your Loved One with Lung Cancer Means Caring About Biomarker Testing

Lung cancer biomarker testing—sometimes referred to as tumor, molecular, genomic or genetic testing—looks for changes in the tumor's DNA. Results from biomarker testing influence treatment options, including if patients are able to go on a cancerfighting pill or immunotherapy.
