Fighting for Air

DEAR FRIENDS:

It has been a year of great success in the Fight for Air for the American Lung Association of the Southeast, one marked with extreme dedication to every battle by our volunteers, advocates and staff. Our most notable legislative victory was the passage of a one dollar surcharge on tobacco products in Florida, which will reduce smoking rates and saves lives. As a leader in advocating for tobacco prevention efforts, the American Lung Association fought tirelessly to educate legislators on the important impact this legislation would have on the lives of Floridians. Additionally, the American Lung Associations in Georgia and South Carolina were on the front line protecting their local communities by passing strong smoke-free air laws.

Our fight would not be possible without the hard work and commitment of those who devote themselves to our cause. These "warriors" for clean air and healthy lungs are helping to fulfill our mission in the neighborhoods we serve. Without them, we would not be able to provide our arsenal of programs and services that improve lung health and prevent lung disease. Mark Carey, an Orlando area volunteer who received the national American Lung Association Volunteer Excellence Award, is just one example. He serves as a facilitator for the "Open Airways for School" program, even while he completed two tours in Afghanistan as an Air Force Reserve medical services officer.

This same commitment drives the critical research being conducted in the battle to find cures and better treatments for lung disease. In addition to funding the work of numerous individual researchers, the American Lung Association of the Southeast also supports two of the most successful Asthma Clinical Research Centers in the American Lung Association network. The American Lung Association Asthma Clinical Research Centers Network is the nation's largest not-for-profit network of clinical research centers dedicated to the study of asthma treatment research. Furthermore, a Jacksonville-based research team recently made a significant breakthrough in lung cancer research. Alan P. Fields, Ph.D. and his team at the Mayo Clinic Florida have identified a gene responsible for lung cancer development in mice. Research like this provides hope that one day we will win our fight for air and find cures for all people suffering from lung disease.

We thank you for all you do to improve the lives and lung health of your families, friends and neighbors.

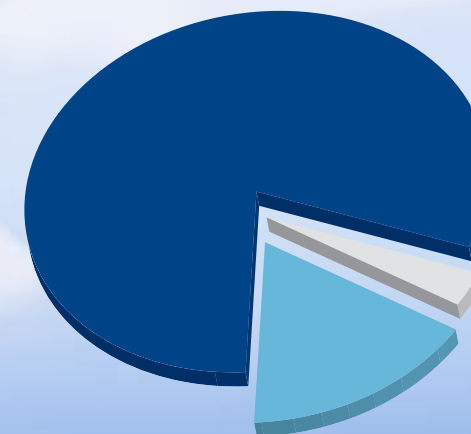
