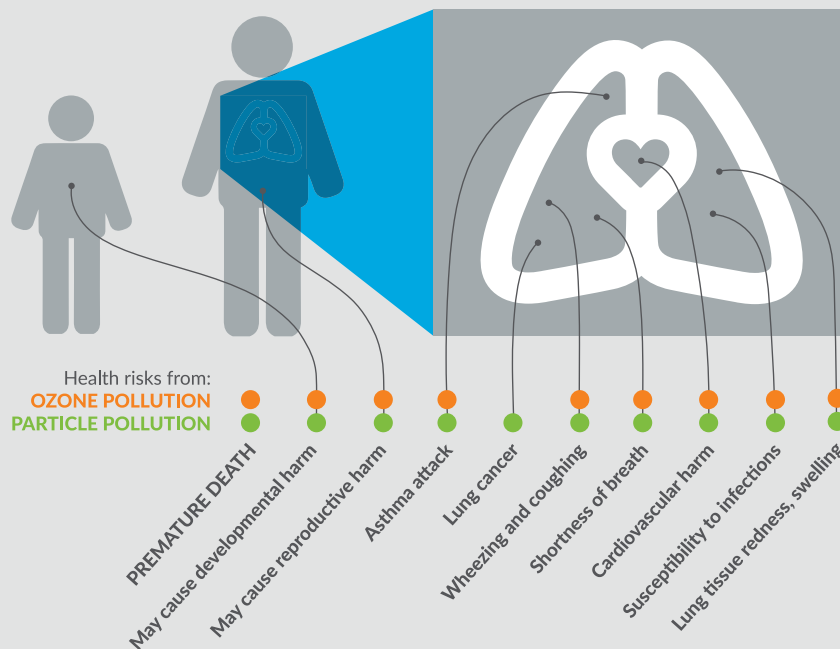


Air pollution remains a serious threat to public health. For 19 years, the American Lung Association has issued a report card on air quality throughout the United States. Did your city or county make the grade?
