Dear Senator/Representative:

I write to you with the American Lung Association's appropriations requests for fiscal year 2025 (FY25). The American Lung Association is the leading organization working to save lives by improving lung health and preventing lung disease through education, advocacy and research. The people we represent – including people with asthma, COPD and lung cancer – rely on federal funding for research, disease prevention and education and more.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the National Institutes for Health (NIH) are key public health agencies that are working to improve the lives of those at risk of or living with lung disease. The need to adequately fund these agencies has only been underscored in recent years. Continued youth tobacco use, worsening environmental hazards like excessive heat and wildfires and increases in chronic lung diseases are just some examples of the need for funding that protects lung health.

The American Lung Association takes our responsibility as the trusted champions for lung health to share with you what key public health agencies and programs need to protect health, promote health equity and prevent future healthcare costs. We continue to advocate for sustained, robust and predictable funding for all three key public health agencies in FY25 – specifically \$11.6 billion for CDC, \$12 billion for EPA and \$51.3 billion for NIH.

The Lung Association also asks for your leadership in opposing adding policy riders to appropriations bills. Policy riders can undermine public health efforts, jeopardizing the health and safety of your constituents. The Lung Association opposes all harmful riders, especially policy provisions that would weaken key lung health protections provided by the Clean Air Act and the Tobacco Control Act.
