Yet, despite this great progress, a recent survey conducted by the **American Lung Association** and **Cancer Treatment Centers of America®** reveals that lung cancer awareness is still critically low, especially among women.

The **LUNG FORCE** 2020 National Lung Health Barometer surveyed a nationally representative sample of 4,000 women and men about their awareness and understanding of lung cancer:

### Lung Cancer is the #1 Cancer Killer



Although there has been a dramatic 28% improvement in the lung cancer survival rate over the past decade,\* **more work needs to be done.**

### Awareness Remains Low



Barometer findings reveal that only **8% of adults** know that lung cancer is the #1 cancer killer of women.



**73% of adults** have not spoken with their doctor about their risk for lung cancer.



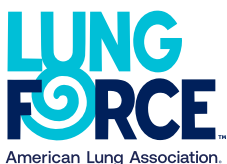
Too few adults understand that lung cancer is among the cancers **most likely to affect women (20%) and men (34%).**
