Free Cessation Services Available to Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare Enrollees

As of January 1, 2016, Minnesotans insured through Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare have free coverage for individual and group cessation counseling and smoking cessation medications. Prior to this policy change, enrollees had a co-pay for cessation medications. Research has shown that removing barriers to accessing cessation treatment, such as co-pays, increases the likelihood that patients will use cessation medications and try to quit.

Available Cessation Services

- Free individual and group cessation counseling
- Phone counseling either through the patient's health plan or through QUITPLAN® Services
- Free FDA-approved cessation medications, with <u>prescription</u>

MHCP Provider Manual Definition of Physician Extenders*

Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP) covers health services provided by a physician extender under the supervision of the physician. Physician extender services are not covered unless they replace or substitute for the physician service.

- <u>Physician Extender:</u> PA or APRN who chooses not to enroll with MHCP, genetic counselor, registered nurse, licensed acupuncturist or pharmacist who is in one of the following professional environments:
 - Employed by the physician provider
 - Employed by the same provider organization that employs the physician
 - Supervised by a physician
- Registered Nurse (RN): A nurse licensed under and within the scope of Minnesota statutes.
- <u>Genetic Counselor or Geneticist:</u> A person who is board certified by the American Board of Genetic Counseling (ABGC).

QUITPLAN Services offers a wide array of free tools to help people quit using tobacco. Visit www.guitplan.com or call 1-888-354-PLAN (7526) for additional information.

The QUITPLAN Helpline offers a complete tobacco cessation program that includes one-on-one phone coaching with trained tobacco counselors, free nicotine patches, gum or lozenges, plus additional integrated tools (e.g. text messages and email). The QUITPLAN Helpline is available to Minnesotans who are uninsured or whose insurance does not cover telephone counseling and/or cessation medications.

Individual QUITPLAN Services, available to all adult Minnesotans, include:

- Starter Kit of Patches, Gum or Lozenges
- Text Messaging
- Email Program
- Quit Guide



All Minnesota Health Care Program enrollees have access to Individual QUITPLAN Services. Enrollees who do not have coverage for telephone counseling can enroll in the QUITPLAN Helpline.

Call it Quits Referral Program

The Call it Quits Referral Program enables health care providers to use a single form and fax number to refer patients who use tobacco to quitline support.
