
# Accessing In-Train



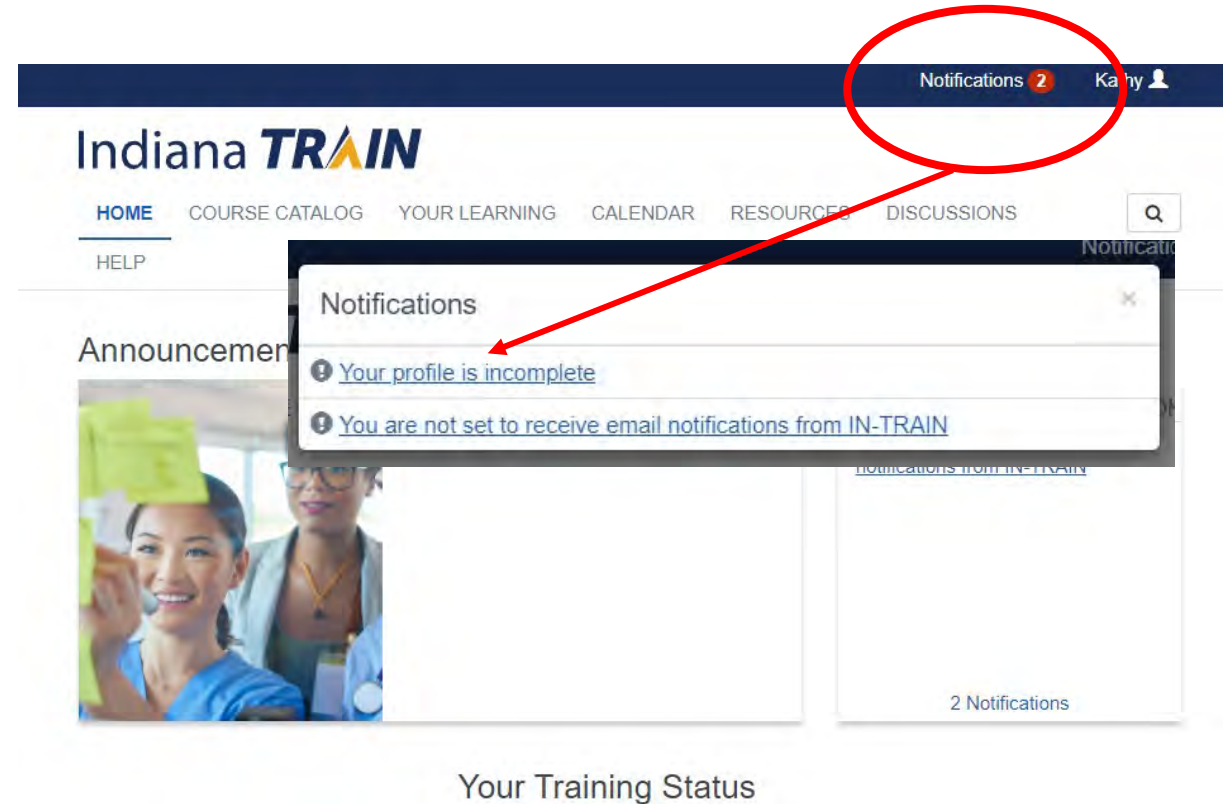

- In the 'Notifications' pop-up, click on 'Your profile is incomplete'.



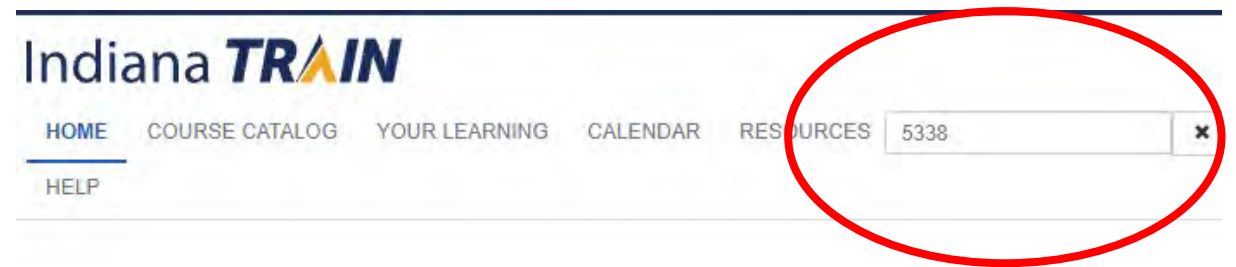
# Creating an Account continued

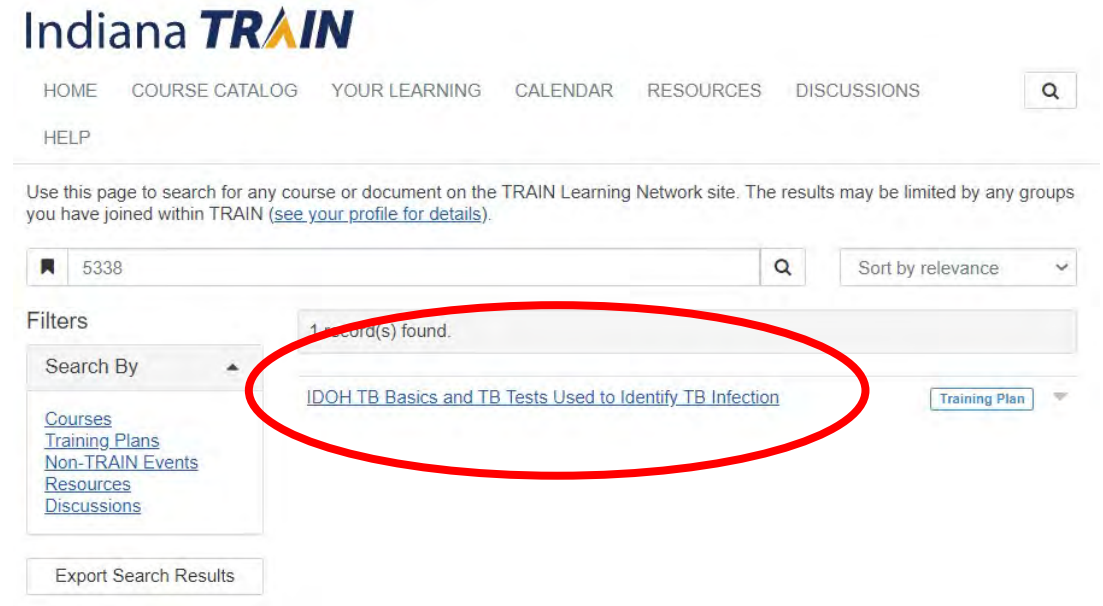
# Registering for the Training Plan

  - Upon passing the course exam, a certificate of course completion will be generated.



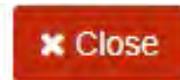
