Strong tobacco control laws in these top 10 cities can make a big difference in protecting more than a quarter of California's residents from secondhand smoke and other dangers of tobacco.

While San Jose, San Francisco, and Long Beach all passed Emerging Issues policies in 2015, more can and should be done to reduce the harmful effects of tobacco use in our most populous areas. Below is a table showing the grades for the ten most populous cities in California.
