

Call for Photo Contest Entries!

Deadline for submissions is Sunday, **May 27, 2018**.

EVERY K-12 student in Hawai'i has a chance to win a Fujifilm Instax Mini 9 Instant Camera Film! Submit original photographs representing the Hanulike Healthy Air Initiative and be eligible to win. Hanulike, meaning “*we breathe together*,” is an appreciation that whatever we do affects our family, friends, classmates, and neighbors. This spirit of interconnectedness that brings together programs in tobacco cessation, asthma management, and indoor air quality to protect the air in our homes, schools, and even vehicles.

Contest Rules:

1. Eligibility: participants must be residents of Hawaii currently enrolled in grades K through 12.
2. All participants under age 18 must *have signed permission with media release form from a parent or guardian* to be eligible to win. Participants 18 and older must also sign media release forms.
3. Only one entry per student.
4. Entries must include student's name, grade, school, and signed permission and media release form.
5. Submissions must be made electronically in .pdf, .jpeg, .hief or .png file formats with a maximum file size of 1 MB.
6. *By signing the parental permission and media release form, entries become the property of the American Lung Association and may be used by them without compensation.*
7. Deadline for submission is Sunday, **May 27, 2018**. *Only entries submitted in approved formats, with student's name, grade, school, and parental permission and media release form are eligible!*

Categories:

The three judging categories will be based on groupings by academic grade level:

- Grades K-4
- Grades 5-8
- Grades 9-12

Judging criteria:

Entries will be evaluated on artistic quality and how well they represent the concept of Hanulike.

Prizes:

One winner from each category will receive a Fujifilm Instax Mini 9 Instant Camera with film.
