



## Sample Land Acknowledgment Statement to Open Events and Gatherings

We also would like to acknowledge the contemporary Tribal leaders' and other Tribe members' whose contributions to the field of commercial tobacco prevention, control, and treatment, as well as clean air policies, benefits us all.
